# Services available on radio or television:-BBC Radio 4 Sunday Worship - 8.10am 24th May - 'Living well while waiting'

The Bishop of Sheffield Pete Wilcox (Sophie Jelley is his Suffragan Bishop of Doncaster) and Catherine Fox reflect on living well during this time of waiting. For people yearning for things to be 'normal' again it seems that there may be a long time to wait. Many plans for the Summer, including weddings and ordinations have been cancelled, so what can we do to stay positive in this period of continued hoping and uncertainty? The Miraculous Catch of Fish (John 21:1-14), the reading on 3<sup>rd</sup> May, leads them to suggest that old plans and hopes can be transformed by Jesus. After Jesus' resurrection the disciples had gone back to what they knew, fishing in the Sea of Galilee, but they didn't catch anything until the risen Lord appeared and they caught more fish than they could cope with.
