### Restarting Benefice services in Church

We have highlighted in recent Newsheets the key considerations and restrictions in a return to holding services in Church. Taking these and the overriding safety and health issues into account we will hold a **Service of Holy Communion for the Benefice at 9.00am on Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> August at St Alban's** Where the current space and social distancing required enables this to be managed safely in a larger building. Following the holidays we will follow this with a **Service weekly for the Benefice at 9.00am from Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> September at St Alban's.** **The Online Sunday Services at 10.30am will also continue.**

We will be finding our feet as we move forward and hope that Government and Church guidelines will enable us to re-commence services in the more restricted space at St John's if we are able to find suitable clergy cover.

**Meanwhile, St. John's continues to be open weekly for individual private prayer for the whole Benefice.**

### Churt Volunteer Drivers (CVD) Medical Transport Service at risk. Can you help?

CVD is a group of drivers who volunteer to take people from the Parish to the surgery, hospital, dentist etc at very reasonable rates. Frimley Park is the furthest destination. There is little or no public transport to these. This service is hugely valued, has been running for over 20 years and is available to all local residents. Most drivers average 2 or 3 lifts a month. As the average age of the drivers is rising numbers have dropped off and we now need new and younger volunteers to help, to spread the load and to maintain CVD particularly in the current pandemic where most of our drivers are over 70, if this much needed facility is to continue. It was so good to see how many volunteered at the start of the Covid crisis and it would be wonderful if some of the volunteers could become drivers.
